how many are being driven from their homes?

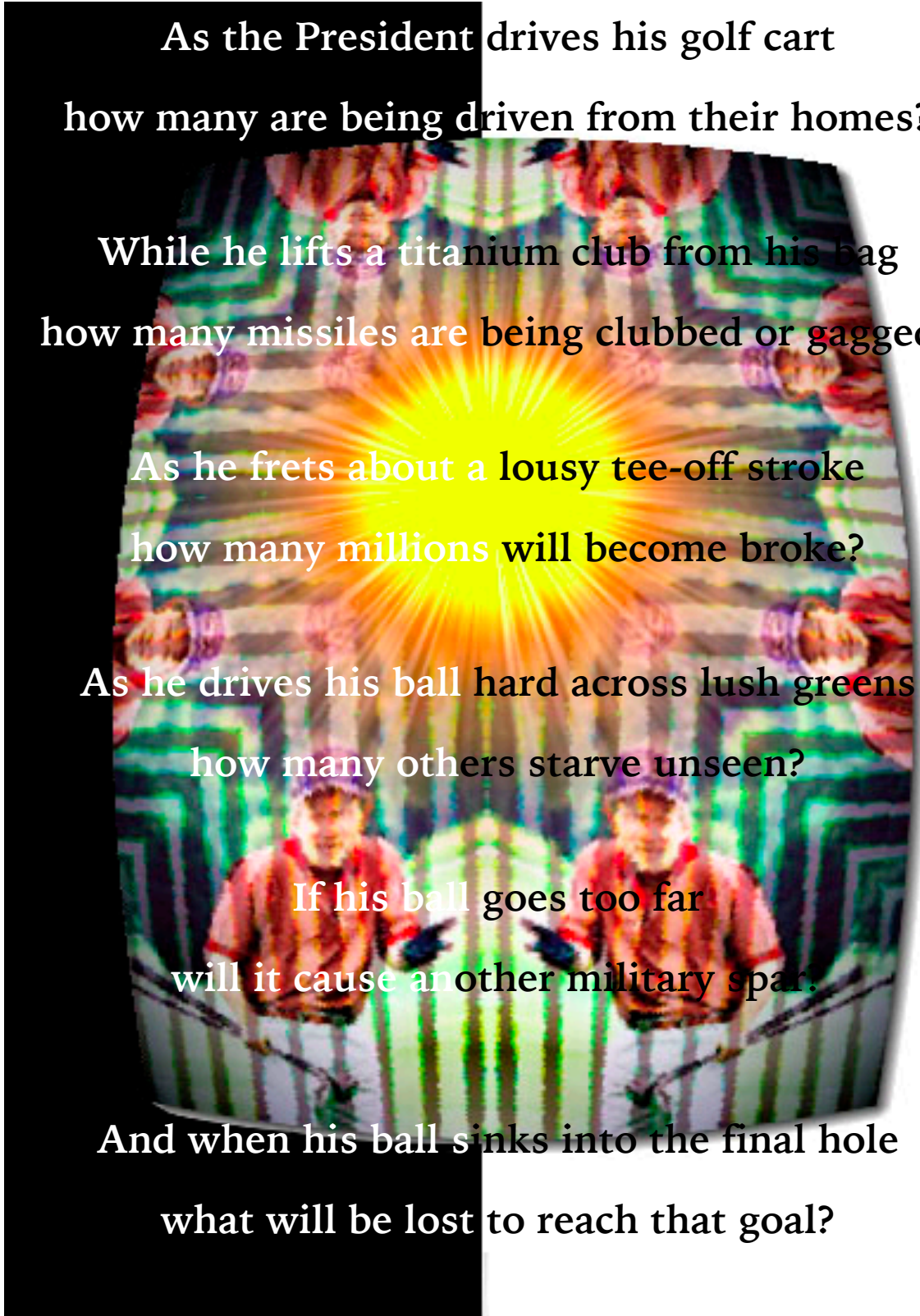
While he lifts a titanium club from his bag
